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Abstract:

This study includes the concept of circular economy of textiles as a source of inspiration for printed ladies' clothing supplements The study includes a field study in a group of textile factories ready-towear in the 10th city of Ramadan in the Arab Republic of Egypt to study the losses resulting from the manufacturing process and assemble several fabric residues resulting from the manufacturing process from some of the targeted factories in the study and benefit from them and recycle them and use them to manufacture an innovative product as a creative industry fit for the production of women's clothing supplements using various manual techniques to print textiles and add printed designs to keep abreast of global fashion trends 2025/2026 instead of disposing of these residues and staying in the bin, causing environmental pollution resulting from industry losses and increasing carbon emissions, thereby increasing the problem of climate change.
