These behaviors can lead to treatment delays, negatively affecting the child's oral health. Therefore, the research aims to identify design considerations for the dental clinic space that enhance the psychological and behavioral needs of children and to provide recommendations for creating child-friendly dental treatment clinics. Thus, the importance of the research lies in finding solutions for the interior design of dental clinics to manage children's behavior, allowing for better health care. Additionally, the research contributes to improving and creating a positive therapeutic environment that can help the child's mental health and reduce their feelings of fear and anxiety.

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
